OPINION

Nielsen Freight Lines, presently rendering service as a highway common carrier generally between the Bay area, on the one hand, and points on U. S. Highway 101 between Novato and Santa Rosa and Sonoma, El Verano and Boyes Springs, on the other hand, requests authority to extend service between all points located on, or within three miles laterally on each side of the following routes:

Between Sears Point and Santa Rosa via State Highways 37 and 12;

Between Schellville and Sonoma-Napa County line via State Highways 37 and 12;

Between Schellville and Kenwood via unnumbered County Highway through El Verano and Glen Ellen;

Between Sonoma and Petaluma via unnumbered County Highways;

Between Sonoma and State Highway 37 via unnumbered County Highways through Vineburg;

Between Stege and Black Point Cutoff via Ridge Road.

A public hearing was held before Examiner Thomas E. Daly on June 22, 1955, at San Francisco, and the matter was submitted. There was no appearance made in protest to the authority sought.

Applicant appears to possess the necessary facilities, equipment and financial ability to provide the proposed extended service.

As justification for the authority sought it is alleged that by Decision No. 45232, dated January 9, 1951, in Application No. 31462, applicant was authorized to extend service to Sonoma, El Verano and Boyes Springs; that concurrently therewith similar authority was granted to Merchants Express Corporation; that Merchants Express Corporation has filed an application seeking an extension substantially the same as applicant herein proposes; that applicant presently conducts a daily service over routes in the Sonoma Valley and finds it uneconomical to operate through the territory without being able to provide service therein; that the situation has resulted in confusion on the part of customers and drivers; that on occasions when shipments are mistakenly accepted they are transported under applicant's permitted authority; that with the substantial growth of the area the problem is becoming more serious and that applicant should be permitted to enjoy the same competitive advantages as Merchants Express Corporation.

After consideration, the Commission is of the opinion and so finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the authority sought.

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted.
- (b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and upon not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file, in triplicate, and concurrently make effective appropriate tariffs.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
