O P I N I O N

Katie Ernst is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to a certificate of public convenience and necessity and permits issued by this Commission.

She seeks an order authorizing her to extend and conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of commodities usually sold and distributed by drug wholesalers, jobbers and drug specialty houses, and bicycle and motorcycle dealers generally between Los Angeles and Vernon to Long Beach, Compton, Wilmington, San Pedro and Terminal Island, including intermediate and points latterly within five miles thereof.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, it appears that as of the date of the filing of the application applicant was conducting her operations, authority for the extension of which is sought herein, within the scope of the permitted authority heretofore issued by this Commission. Such operations not having constituted highway common carriage, the sought certificate of public convenience and necessity is not a requisite for their continuance. The application will therefore be denied.

ORDER

The Commission having considered the application and representations filed herein, now therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 36393 is denied.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.
