O P I N I O N

Milford G. Johnson is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits issued by this Commission.

He seeks an order authorizing him to conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of commodities sold, handled and distributed by drug jobbers, drug wholesalers, drug supply houses, and paper product suppliers, and which are used, carried and handled by drug stores, generally between Los Angeles and Vernon, on the one hand, and Glendora, Colton, Corona, Tustin, and San Clemente, on the other hand, including certain named intermediates and points within five-mile radii thereof.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, it appears that as of the date of the filing of the application applicant was conducting his operations within the scope of the permitted authority heretofore issued by this Commission.

Such operations not having constituted highway common carriage, the sought certificate of public convenience and necessity is not a requisite for their continuance. The application will therefore be denied.

O R D E R

The Commission has considered the application and representations filed herein, Now Therefore

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 36397 is denied.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.
