O P I N I O N

Associated Transportation Co., Inc., is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to certificates of public convenience and necessity issued by this Commission.

Applicant seeks an order authorizing it to extend its service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of general commodities, with certain exceptions, between Red Bluff, Modesto, and San Francisco Territory, via U. S. Highways 99, 99E, 99W, and 40, serving all intermediate points on U. S. Highways 99, 99E, and 99W, and all off-route points between U. S. Highways 99E and 99W (all connecting highways as alternate routes), and between Martinez, Pittsburg, Nichols and Permanente, on the one hand, and Red Bluff and intermediate points north of Sacramento on U. S. Highways 99, 99E and 99W, and off-route points between U. S. Highways 99E and 99W, on the other hand, via U. S. Highway 101, and connecting routes to Permanente; and U. S. Highway 40, State Highways 4 and 24, and connecting routes, to Martinez, Pittsburg, and Nichols.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that the application be granted to the extent set forth in the ensuing order. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equipment, personnel and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation authorized herein. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

The Commission has considered the application and representations filed herein, Now Therefore

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Associated Transportation Co., Inc., authorizing it to operate as a highway common carrier as defined by Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of property between the points particularly set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

(2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed upon notice that it will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of its operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 99. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

(b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and upon not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.

Paul Kunde and R. M. Carroll, doing business as Associated Transportation Co., Inc., by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the above-numbered decision, are authorized to transport agricultural insecticides as listed under that heading in Items 24505 through 24572 of Western Classification No. 75, Cal. P.U.C. No. 8, of George H. Dumas, agent, on the issue date thereof and Supplement No. 40 thereto, between Sacramento and Yuba City.

Such authority does not include the right to render service from, to or between intermediate points.
