## OPINION AND ORDER

C. H. Fowler, doing business as C. H. Fowler Warehouse and Elevator, conducts public utility warehouse operations in two buildings at Stratford for the storage of grain. By this application, as amended, authority is sought to lease one of the buildings to Continental Grain Company for private storage. The proposed lease is for a one-year period.

The application, as amended, shows that Continental Grain Company is the only storer occupying the building proposed to be leased. It also shows that Fowler will continue to operate the remaining building as a public utility warehouse.

In the circumstances it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed leasing of the property described in the application will not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that C. H. Fowler, doing business as C. H. Fowler Warehouse and Elevator, may, within sixty days after the effective date of this order, lease the warehouse property

involved in this proceeding to Continental Grain Company, a corporation, as requested, and execute a lease in a form substantially the same as the form of lease attached to the application, as amended.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
