<u>OPINION</u>

By the above-entitled application, filed April 12, 1955 and as amended July 12, 1955 and July 15, 1955, Central California Telephone Company, a California corporation, seeks an order of this Commission authorizing it to increase rates and charges for exchange telephone service rendered in its Corcoran and Exeter exchanges. Basically, applicant seeks an annual gross revenue increase of \$44,000 annually.

Public hearing in the matter was held before Examiner F. Everett Emerson on September 13, 1955 at Exeter and on September 14, 1955 at Corcoran. The matter was submitted on the latter date.

Rates, Present and Proposed

Present basic telephone rates have remained unchanged in Corcoran since May 8, 1928 and in Exeter since January 1, 1942.

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The rates which applicant requests are compared with existing

rates in the following tabulation.

* Present farmer line rates are quoted on an annual basis and are not limited as to number of parties per line.

Applicant's Operations

Applicant owns and operates a telephone system furnishing exchange and toll service in Corcoran and Exeter and, in addition, is presently constructing a telephone system in Linden and Clements.

The company was incorporated in 1922 as the Corcoran Telephone Exchange and served only the Corcoran area. In 1953 it purchased the properties of Exeter Telephone Company, financed through the sale of preferred and common stock, and changed its name to Central California Telephone Company.

As of March 31, 1955, applicant had 43 employees on its payroll, 20 of whom are stationed at Corcoran and 23 at Exeter. The construction work in Linden and Clements is being done by contract. Certain services, such as preparation of maps, purchase of materials, personnel training, some physical construction, and accounting services are performed for applicant by Kern Mutual Telephone Company.

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Central office equipment in Corcoran consists of a six-position manual switchboard equipped for full-selective ringing. As of July 31, 1955, the board had 800 lines in place in the multiple. Three positions and 200 lines are being used on a loan basis from the equipment manufacturer. The central office at Exeter also contains a six-position board equipped with full-selective ringing, one position being on a loan basis. In total, the two offices have a capacity of 1,800 lines, have 1,720 lines equipped and have 1,535 lines working. Since the existing equipment will reach its capacity in the foreseeable future, applicant is now completing plans to replace the present manual equipment with dial equipment in both exchanges.

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In recognition of the growth experienced in both exchanges, applicant proposes to increase the base rate areas in Corcoran and Exeter, thereby eliminating or decreasing mileage charges for a substantial number of subscribers in both exchanges. <u>Summary of Presentations</u>

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In this proceeding applicant and the Commission staff presented oral testimony and exhibits respecting the results of applicant's operations. These are summarized in the following tabulations.

As illustrated by the above, the evidence is clear that applicant is earning a less than reasonable return under existing telephone rates. Applicant has demonstrated its need for and entitlement to increased revenues.

<u>Conclusions</u>

The rates for telephone service which applicant has proposed are just and reasonable.

The differences in earnings presentations are relatively minor. Testimony respecting the staff analysis of trend of rate of return indicates a downward trend of about 1/4 of 1 per cent under existing rates. Under proposed rates, the staff indicates a slight upward trend. Such trends have been based upon analyses of operations for only one adjusted year and one estimated year and are not in themselves conclusive. The rates of return under proposed rates for the year 1955, as indicated above, will not be realized in such year.

In view of the evidence we adopt, and find to be fair and reasonable for the purposes of this proceeding, the revenues,

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expenses, rate base and rate of return, set forth in the following tabulation, using the estimated year 1955 as the test year, under the telephone rates proposed by applicant.

The rates which applicant has proposed will be authorized. The enlarged base rate areas proposed by applicant will be of benefit to the public and will be authorized.

Central California Telephone Company having applied to this Commission for an order authorizing it to increase rates and charges for exchange telephone service rendered in its Corcoran and Exeter exchanges, public hearing thereon having been held in each of said communities, the matter having been submitted and now being ready for decision,

IT IS HEREBY FOUND AS A FACT that the increased rates and charges authorized herein are justified and that existing rates and charges, in so far as they differ from those authorized herein, are for the future unjust and unreasonable; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that applicant is authorized to file in quadruplicate with this Commission, on or after the date of this order and in conformity with the provisions of General Order No. 96, tariffs having rates and charges for telephone service in accordance with Appendix A attached to this order and, after not less than five days' notice to the public and to this Commission, to make such rates and charges effective for all exchange telephone service rendered on and after December 1, 1955.

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IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that coincidental with establishment of the new rates hereinabove authorized, applicant shall establish base rate areas at Corcoran and at Exeter, the boundaries of which shall be not less than as set forth in Exhibit E and Exhibit F attached to its application herein and, within thirty days thereafter, shall file with this Commission four copies of maps of said areas delineating thereon the precise boundaries thereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
