Frasher, deceased, will not voluntarily consummate the transaction as authorized and by reason of this refusal litigation and appeals therefrom which may extend beyond December 31, 1955, have ensued, and written request having been made by the attorney for Consolidated Copperstate Lines, one of the applicants herein, for an extension of time to and including December 31, 1956, and good cause appearing, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the time within which the authority granted in said Decision No. 50408, as amended by said Decision No. 50814, herein, may be exercised, shall be extended from December 31, 1955, to and including December 31, 1956, and ordering paragraph 8 of said Decision No. 50408, as amended by said Decision No. 50814, is hereby further amended to read as follows: -18. The authority herein granted may be exercised after the effective date hereof and will terminate if not exercised on or before December 31, 1956, unless said date is extended by order of this Commission.
