O R D E R

State of California, Department of Public Works, is authorized to construct State Route 68 (U.S. 101) at separated grades over the track of Southern Pacific Company, at Sierra Point, San Mateo County, at the location as shown by map (Exhibit B) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. E-7.6-A. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Company, shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D except that authority is granted during the period of construction to deviate from Section 2.1 of said general order to the extent of reducing vertical overhead clearance to 20 feet 0 inches above top of rail, provided, that the Southern Pacific Company shall issue an appropriate timetable bulletin advising of the temporary impaired clearance condition, forbidding train crews to ride on top of

cars at this location and instructing trainmen not to work steam while passing beneath the structure.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within two years unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
