In the Matter of the Investigation into the rates, rules, regulations, charges, allowances and practices of all common carriers, highway carriers and city carriers relating to the transportation of general commodities (commodities for which rates are provided in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2).

Case No. 5432 (Petition No. 71)

SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Petition for Modification No. 71 in Case No. 5432, Kaiser Aircraft & Electronics Corp. seeks modification of the minimum class ratings applicable to the transportation of less-thancarload shipments of aluminum bulk commodity shipping containers, nested, when returning empty or when shipped empty for a returning pay load. Petitioner states that it is engaged in the business of manufacturing and distributing a variety of products, including a new type of aluminum carrier or container used by shippers in shipping their products in bulk within the State of California.¹

Petitioner points out that a rating of third class is applicable to less-than-carload shipments of used aluminum shipping containers, although a substantially lower rating of one-half of fourth class is provided for the transportation of numerous types of other used containers, including various barrels, boxes, crates and drums.² According to the petition, the aluminum containers

The containers manufactured by petitioner are called Nest-A-Bins.

Item No. 330-F of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 provides a one-half of fourth class rating for carriers described in and subject to the provisions of Item No. 300 series of Pacific Southcoast Freight Bureau Exception Sheet No. 1-S, of J. P. Haynes, Agent. Petitioner's aluminum container is described in Item No. 300, but with the provision that the item is not applicable on lessthan-carload traffic between points in California.

compete with the other <u>containers</u> which take the lower rating. The petition states that the aluminum containers are made of highstrength aluminum, that loss and damage claims thereon are negligible, and that (due to their nesting ability) they load much heavier than the competing containers.³

Interested parties have been notified of the filing of the petition. No objection has been offered to its being granted.

Upon consideration of all the facts and circumstances, it is concluded that the proposed rating is reasonable. The petition will be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. That Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" to Decision No. 31606 as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective January 15, 1956, the revised pages attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, which pages are numbered as follows:
