O P I N I O N

Kenneth C. Childs and Horton C. Manor have filed an application requesting the issuance of a highway contract carrier permit.

A public hearing was held on November 15, 1955 at Los Angeles before Examiner Carl Silverhart.

The evidence of record discloses that applicants:

1. Maintain a principal place for the transaction of business in the City of Los Angeles.
2. Possess a radial highway common carrier permit and a city carrier permit.
3. Propose to transport automotive parts, accessories, materials, and supplies; gasoline and diesel engines, and parts thereof; electric supplies, appliances, and motors; paper, paper articles and printers' supplies; paint; spray paint equipment; air compressors; material handling equipment; janitors' supplies; hardware; rubber goods; strapping wire; and fiber and fiberboard and products thereof.

4. Propose to transport such commodities as a highway contract carrier within an area encompassed by a 25-mile radius from the city limits of the City of Los Angeles.

5. Propose to serve 50 shippers with whom they will enter into written contracts in the form marked herein as Exhibit 5.

6. Propose to conduct their operations so as not to engage in the transportation of property, on any public highway, both as a radial highway common carrier and as a highway contract carrier of the same commodities between the same points.

7. Have complied with the provisions of Sections 3572 and 3631 of the Public Utilities Code.

The Commission concludes that a highway contract carrier permit should be issued to applicants. Applicants' attention is particularly directed to the prohibition contained in Section 3542 and to the provisions of Sections 3774, 3775 and 3801 through 3806 of the Public Utilities Code.

O R D E R

A hearing having been held and based upon the evidence therein adduced,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the secretary issue, in the name of the Commission, a highway contract carrier permit to Kenneth C. Childs and Horton C. Manor.

2. That such permit shall be limited to the transportation of automotive parts, accessories, materials, and supplies; gasoline and diesel engines, and parts thereof; electric supplies, appliances, and motors; paper, paper articles and printers' supplies; paint; spray paint equipment; air compressors; material handling equipment; janitors' supplies; hardware; rubber goods; strapping wire; and

fibre and fiberboard and products thereof within an area encompassed by a 25-mile radius extending from the city limits of the City of Los Angeles.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
