## ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By Petition for Modification No. 64, as amended, filed July 15, 1955, in Case No. 5432, Charles R. Wise and John L. Boot, a partnership doing business as Comet Lines, seek authority, as a highway contract carrier, to transport property for Sharp and Dohme between San Francisco and points on the San Francisco peninsula, at a rate less than that established as minimum.

A public hearing of the petition was called by Examiner Carter R. Bishop at San Francisco on August 23, 1955, but no evidence was offered. At the hearing, petitioners stated that they were not ready to proceed and requested that the matter be temporarily removed from the Commission's calendar to enable them to complete their preparation of evidence, which they proposed to offer at an adjourned hearing. The request was granted.

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## C-5432 Pet, 64 NB

On October 24, 1955, the Commission, having received no advice from petitioners since the date of hearing, wrote to them inquiring whether it was their intention to proceed with the petition. On November 29, 1955, no reply to said letter of October 24, 1955, having been received, the Commission informed petitioners that, unless advice to the contrary was received by December 10, 1955, it would be assumed that petitioners did not desire to prosecute the matter further and that the petition herein would be subject to dismissal.

The Commission has received no reply to said letter of November 29, 1955. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Petition for Modification No. 64, as amended, in Case No. 5432 be and it is hereby dismissed.
