Decision No. 5236

BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of ) SACRAMENTO FREICHT LINES, INC., a corporation, for a certificate of public convenience and necossity, authorizing the use of an alternate route.

Sacramento Freight Iines, Inc., presentiy serves as a highway common carrier between Sacramento and the San Francisco Bay area, on the one hand, and Herlong, on the other hand, among other points. It requests authority to operate over U. S. Highway 40 and California Highway 89 via Iruckee, Sierraville, Loyalton and Vinton, between Sacramento and Heriong, as an aiternate route, for operating convenience only.

As justification for the authority sought applicant alleges that it frequentiy has truckioad shipments between Bay Area points, Sacramento and Herlong; that use of the proposed alternate route would result in a saving of 53 miles between Sacramento and Herlong and a saving of 33 miles between San Francisco and Herlong; that the proposed alternate route has fewer curves and is therefore more desirable and economical to traverse.

After consideration the Commission is of the opinion and so finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the authority sought. A public hearing does not appear to be necessary. In the interest of simplicity the proposed extension will be included in a new cortificate which will be hereinafter granted in the place and stead of applicant's existing operative rights.

## ORDER

Application having been flied and the Commission being in formed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:
(1) That in the place and stead of its present operating author pity a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Sacramento Freight Lines authorizing it to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of commodities between the points and over the routes as hereinafter set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof.
(2) That the operative fights granted by Decisions Nos. 35169 , $42352,45259,47175,47252,48005,49870,50910$ and 52196 are hereby revoked.
(3) That in providing the service herein authorized in paragraph (I) hereof, applicant shall observe the following service regulations:
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted.
(b) Within sixty' days after the effective date hereof, and upon not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establist the service herein authorized and isle, in triplicate, and concurrently make effective appropriate tariffs.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days
after the date hereof.


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(A) General Commodities
(1) Between Sacramento and Portola and intemediate points. Between the junction of State Highways Nos. 24 and 89 and Crescent Mills, Greenville, Taylorville and intermediate points and points within two miles laterally of the highways traversed. Sald authority is subject to the restriction that no shipment shall be transported between Sacramento, on the one hand, and points and places between IIncoin and oroville, inclusive, on the other hand, nor localiy between Iincoln and Oroville.

Service shall be provided over the following route:
From Sacramento to Marysvilie, via U. S. Highway No. 99E; from Marysville to Portola, via State Highway No. 24 ; from the function of State Fighways Nos. 24 and 89 (approximately two miles west of Keddie) via State Highway No. 89 to Greenvilie and via unnumbered highways diverging from State Highway No. 89 at Greenville and at or near Crescent Milis to Taylorsville, this being in the nature of a loop operation; returning over the same routes in the reverse direction.
(2) Between Sacramento, on the one hand, and Loyalton and intermediate points between Portola and Heriong; inciusive, on the other hand, via U. S. Highways 40,40 Alternate and 395, thence via unnumbered state or county road to Eerlong. Also, for operating convenience only, which does not authorize service to, from or between intermediate points, with the exception of toyalton, applicant may operate over the following alternate route, comencing at the junction of U. S. Highways 99 and 40 , Just north of Sacramento, thence via U. S. Highway 40 via Truckee, State Highway 89 via Slerravilie, unnumbered highway via Loyaiton to Vinton, on U. S. Hiehway 40 Alternate.
(3) Between San Francisco, Richmond, Hayward, and points intermediate between Richmond and Hayward, on the one hand, and Quincy and Ferlong, on the other hand via U. S. Highway 40, 40 Alternate, 395 and unmmbered state or county road to Ferlong.

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(4) Between Los Angeles Territory, as defined in Item No. 270-3 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, and Sacramento (and a five-mile radius of sacramento), and intermediate points, via J. S. Highway 99.
(5) Between San Francisco Territory, as defined in Item No. 270-3 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, on the one hand, and Los Angeles Territory, as defined in Item No. 270-3 of Minimum Rate Tarifi No. 2, on the other hand. The right to render service to, from, or between intermedlate points is not included hereunder.
(6) Sacramento and Los angeles and intermediate points on U. S. Highway 99, San Jose and Santa Barbara, on the one hand, and San Bernardino, on the other hand.

(8) Between Los Angeles Territory as defined in Item No. 270-3 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, on the one hand, and points intermediate between Sacramento and Redding (excluding Sacramento) on the other hand, via U. S. Highways 99, 99E, 99W, 40 and $40-\mathrm{A}$ and State Highways 20, 24 and 32. The right to render local service, to, from, or between points, intermediate between Sacramento and Redding, is not included hereunder. As an alternate route for the transportation of expiosives, appilcant may operate from Manteca over State Highway 120, U. S. Highway 50, unnumbered county road, known as Banta Cut-off, J. S. Highway 50, unnumbered county road via Byron, State Highway 4 and unnumbered county road to Port Chicago.
(9) Between Nimbus and Secramento via J. S. Highway 40.

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(10) Applicant shall not (2) transport any shipments between San Francisco Territory and Sacramento, (2) provide local service between points within San Francisco Territory, (3) provide local service between points within Los Angeles Territory.
(II) Applicant shall not transport any shipments of:
(a) Jsed household goods and personal effects.
(b) Automobiles, trucks and buses, $\nabla 1 z .:$ new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (inciuding jeeps) ambuiances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses, bus chassis.
(c) Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulis, calves, cattie, cows, darry cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
(d) Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment.
(e) Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semi-plastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semi-trailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
( 1 ) Commodities when transported in buik in dump trucks, or in hopper-type trucks.
(g) Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.

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(b) Commodities in bulk, and articles of unusual value.
(B) Fresh Fruit and Vegetablos

Between points and places along the following routes:
(1) J. S. Highway 70 between Redlands and Los Angeles and 10 miles laterally of said highway.
(2) State Highway 71 between Elsinore and Pomona and within 25 miles laterally of said highway.
(3) U.S. Highway 101 or 101-A between San Clemente and Los Angeles and within 10 miles laterally of said highway.
(4) T. S. Eighway 101 or 101-A between Goleta and Los Angeles and within 10 miles lateraliy of said highway.
(5) J. S. Highway 201 and State Highway 150 between Goleta and Santa Paula and State Highway 126 between Santa Paula and Castaic Junct on, via State Highway 125, and within 10 miles laterally of said highways.
(6) Between points and places in the Los Angeles Territory as define in Item No. 270-A on First Revised Page 34 of Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2, (now Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2) on the one hand, and on the other hand, Fresno and Modesto as well as points and places on and along the following routes:
U. S. Highway 50 between Sacramento and Placervilie;
J. S. Highway 99-E between Marysvilie and Sacramento;

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T. S. Highway 40 between Fairfield and Colfax;

State Highway 12 between Fairfield and Lodi;
State Righway 28 between Davis and Winters;
State Highway 24 between Sacramento and Wainut Grove;

State Highway 12 and unnumbered county highways 99 and Isleten, subject to the following restrictions:
(a) The transportation of fresh fruits and vegetables originating or destined off the highways traversed and outside of incorporated communities shall be ifmited to shiprents of not less than 10,000 pounds, or to shipments which shall carry a charge no lower than that applicable to shipments of not less than 10,000 pounds.
(b) No shipment of Iresh fruits or vegetables shali be transported which has both origin and destination along the routes or within the territory described in subparagraphs (1) to (6) inciusive of paragraph (B).
(C) Canned Goods

Between Sacramento and Lodi, on the one hand, and the (6) incin and places described in subparagraphs (I) to (6) inclusive, of paragraph (B), on the other hand.
(D) Explosives, Ammunitions and Component Parts

Between Sacramento and Nimbus, on the one hand, and Port Chicago, on the other hand, via J. S. Highway 50 , and J. S. Highway 40, State Elghway 4, and other appropriate substitute public highways.
