In the Matter of the Application of SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA FREIGHT LINES, a corporation, for an order exempting from its certificates of public convenience and necessity the right to transport certain commodities.

In the Matter of the Application of SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA FREIGHT FORWARDERS, a corporation, for an order exempting from its authority to operate as an express corporation and freight forwarder the right to transport certain commodities.

ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By these applications, as amended, Southern California Freight Lines and Southern California Freight Forwarders, a highway common carrier and an express corporation, respectively, seek authority to exclude certain commodities from those which they hold themselves out to transport in common carriage.

Public hearings in the applications were held before Examiner C. S. Abernathy in Los Angeles on July 29 and August 1, 1955, at which time the matters were taken under submission for decision. On September 27, 1955, the Commission ordered that further hearings in the matters be held for specified purposes.

Applicants have since requested that their respective applications be dismissed without prejudice.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above-entitled applications be, and they hereby are, dismissed without prejudice.
