## FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 52461 dated January 9, 1956, in Application No. 37497, Sacramento Freight Ines, Inc., was granted an in-1ieu certificate. Because of several inadvertent omissions the certificate will be amended.

Therefore, good cause appearing,
IT IS ORDERTD that Appendix A, attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof, is hereby substituted in the place and stead of Appendix A attached to Decision No. 52461 dated January 9 , 1956, in Application No. 37497.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereor.

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## (A) General Commodities

(1) Between Sacramento and Portola and intermediate points. Between the Junction of State Highways Nos. 24 and 89 and Crescent Milis, Greenville, Taylorvilie and intermediate points and points within two miles laterally of the highways traversed. Sald authority is subject to the restriction that no shipment shail be transported between Sacramento, on the one hand, and points and places between Lincoin and orovilie, inclusive, on the other hand, nor locally between Inncoln and Oroville.

Service shell be provided over the following route:
From Sacramento to Marysville, via U. S. Highway No. 99E; from Marysville to Portola, via State Eighway No. 24 ; from the junction of State Eighways Nos. 24 and 89 (approximately two miles west of Keddie) via State Highway No. 89 to Greenvilie and via unnumbered highways divergIng from State Highway No. 89 at Greenville and at or near Crescent Milis to Taylorsvilie, this being in the nature of a loop operation; returning over the same routes in the reverse direction.
(2) Between Sacramento, on the one hand, and Loyalton and intermediate points between Portola and Heriong, inciusive, on the other hand, via U.S. Highways 40,40 Alternate and 395, theace via unnumbered state or county road to Herlong. Also, for operating convenience only, which does not authorize service to, from or between intermediate points, with the exception of Ioyalton, applicant may operate over the following alternate route, comencing at the junction of 0 . S. Highways 99 and 40 , just north of Sacramento, thence via U. S. Highway 40 via Truckee, State Highway 89 via Sierravilie, unnumbered highway via Loyalton to Vinton, on U. S. Highway 40 Alternate.
(3) Between San Francisco, Richmond, Hayward, and points intermediate between Richmond and Hayward, on the one hand, and quincy and Heriong, on the other hand via J. S. Eighway 40, 40 Alternate, 395 and unnumbered state or county road to Herlong.

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(4) Between Los Angeles Territory, as defined in Item No. 270-3 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, and Sacramento (and a five-mile radius of Sacramento), and intermediate points, via J. S. Highway 99.
(5) Between San Francisco Territory, as defined in Item No. 270-3 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, on the one hand, and Los Angeles Territory, as defined in Item No. 270-3 of Minimu Rate Tariff No. 2, on the other hand. The right to render service to, from, or between intermediate points is not included hereunder.
(6) Sacramento and Los Angeles and intermediate points on U. S. Highway 99, San Jose and Santa Barbara, on the one hand, and San Bernardino, on the other hand.

(8) Between Los Angeles Territory as defined in Item No. 270-3 of Minimum Rate Tarisf No. 2, on the one hand, and points intermediate between Sacramento and Redaing (excluding Sacramento) on the other hand, 71 Ia U. S. Highways 99, 99E, 99W, 40 and $40-\mathrm{A}$ and State Elghways 20, 24 and 32. The right to render local service, to, from, or between points, intermediate between Sacramento and Reding, is not inciuded hereunder. As an alternate route for the transportation of explosives, appiicant may operate from Manteca over State Highway 120, J. S. Highway 50, unnumbered county road, known as Banta Cut-off, J. S. Highway 50, unnumbered county road via Byron, State Highway 4 and unnumbered county road to Port Chicago.
(9) Between Nimbus and Sacramento via 0. S. Highway 40.

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(10) Applicant shail not (1) transport any shipments between San Francisco Territory and Sacramento, (2) provide local service between points within Son Francisco Territory, (3) provide local service between points within Los Angeles Territory.
(11) Applicant shall not transport any shipments of:
(a) Used household goods and personal effects.
(b) Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps) ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined; buses, bus chassis.
(c) Iivestock, Viz.: bucks, bulis, calves, cattie, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
(d) Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigeraged equipment, except between points and places authorized to be served in paragraphs $(A)(1),(A)(2),(A)(3)$ and $(A)(4)$ of this order.
(e) Liquids, compressed gases, comodities in semi-plastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semi-trailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.


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(f) Commodities when transported in buik in dump trucks, or in hopper-type trucks.
(g) Commodities when transported in motor vehicies equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
(h) Commodities in buik, except between points and places authorized to be served in paragraphs (A) (I) and (A) (2) of this order, and articles of unusual value.
(B) Fresh Fruit and Vegetobles

Between points and places along the following routes:
(1) J. S. Highway 70 between Redlands and Los Angeles and 10 miles lateraliy of said tighway.
(2) State Filghway 71 between Elsinore and Pomona and within 25 miles laterally of said highway.
(3) U. S. Highway 101 or 101-A between San Clemente and Los Angeles and within 10 miles lateraliy of sald highway.
(4) J. S. Elghway 101 or 101-A between Goleta and Los Angeles and within 10 mlles laterally of said highway.
(5) J. S. Eighway 101 and State Highway 150 between Goleta and Santa paula and State Eighway 125 between Santa Paula and Castaic Junction, via State Highway 126, and within 10 miles lateraliy of sald highways.
(6) Between points and places in the Los Angeles Territory as defined in Item No. 270-A on First Revised Page $3^{4}$ of Highway Carifers.

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Tariff No. 2, (now Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2) on the one hand;

And on the otiner hand, the following points and places and within 20 miles lateraliy of the highways traversed.
(7) Fresno and Modesto;
(8) 0. S. Eighway 50 between Sacramento and Placervilile;
(9) J. S. Highway 99-E between Marysville and Sacramento;
(10) U. S. Highway 40 between Fairfield and Colfax;
(11) State Eighway 12 between Fairfield and Lodi;
(12) State E゙ghway 28 between Davis and Winters;
(13) State Highway 24 between Sacramento and Wainut Grove;
(14) State Fighway 12 and unnumbered county highways between U.S. Highway 99 and Isleton;

Subject to the following restrictions:
(a) The transportation of fresh frults and vegetables origimating or destined off the highways trarersed and outside of incorporated communties shall be innited to shipments of not less than 10,000 pounds, or to shipments which shall carry a charge no lower than that appilcable to shipments of not less than 10,000 pounds.
(b) No shipment of fresh fruits or vegetables shall be transported which has both origin and destination along the routes or within the territory described in subparagraphs (1) to (6) inclusive of paragraph (B).

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(c) Canned Goods

Between Sacramento and Lodi, on the one hand, and the points and places described in subparagraphs (I) to (6) inclusive, of paragraph (B), on the other hand.
(D) Explosives, Ammunitions and Component Parts
(1) Between Sacramento and Nimbus, on the one hand, and Port Chicago; on the other hand, via U. S. Highway 50 , and U. S. Highway 40 , State Fighway 4 , and other appropriate substitute pubiic highways.
(2) Between Sacramento and Nimbus, on the one hand, and the Los Angeles Territory and Azusa, on the other hand.
