ORDER

Applicant has requested an order requiring the abolishment of a grade crossing involving a publicly-used road (North Rabbit Flat Junction Road, also known as Morris Street) and a spur track of Southern Pacific Company in Weed, Siskiyou County, said crossing being designated as Crossing No. C-349.5-C. It appearing that the County of Siskiyou has declined to seek the establishment of a public crossing at this location, public hearings are thereby not necessary, and it further appearing that public interest requires the granting of the application,

IT IS ORDERED that said crossing be removed by Southern Pacific Company and barriers constructed in such manner to effectively prevent the use thereof by vehicular traffic.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that within thirty days after said crossing is so closed applicant shall give the Commission written notice of its compliance with the terms hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
