OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds radial highway common carrier and city carrier permits. By Decision No. 51084 of February 7, 1955, in Application No. 36644, he was authorized to handle C.O.D. (collect on delivery) shipments for Great Western Furniture Co., Home Furniture Company, Kay Furniture Company, Reinert and Riley, and Universal Furniture Company without securing and filing a bond with the Commission as required by General Order No. 84C. This authority expired February 7, 1956. Applicant now seeks its reinstatement with the substitution of J. & L. Cleary, Crest Furniture Co., Slater Furniture Co. and Times Furniture Co. for the Home Furniture Co. The shippers involved have voluntarily waived the protection afforded by the C.O.D. bond requirements.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that reinstatement of relief from the bond filing requirements is justified. Because the conditions under which the C.O.D. service in question is performed may change, the exemption will be limited to a one-year period and made subject to such earlier cancellation, change or extension as circumstances may require. As applicant's previous exemption has expired, the order herein will be made effective on the date hereof.


Therefore, good cause appearing,


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Jay W. Hughes, doing business as Hughes Express, be and he is hereby authorized to handle C.O.D. shipments for J. & L. Cleary, Crest Furniture Co., Great Western Furniture Co., Kay Furniture Co., Reinert and Riley, Slater Furniture Co., Times Furniture Co. and Universal Furniture Co. without providing and filing the bond required by General Order No. 84C; that this authority shall expire one year after the effective date of this order, unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission; and that in all other respects the rules and regulations set forth in General Order No. 84C shall govern the C.O.D. services involved in this proceeding.


This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
