OPINION

The complaint, filed on December 7, 1955, alleges that Gus Soldavini, complainant herein, owns and operates a cafe business at 960 South Genart (sic) Avenue, Los Angeles, California; that there is located therein a telephone with the number Parkview 1-6783; that on or about November 21, 1955, the defendant The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company removed said telephone from said premises on an alleged order of the police authorities asserting that said telephone was used for booking; that said charge is false; and that said telephone is used exclusively in operating the cafe. The complainant requests that the defendant be forthwith ordered to restore the telephone service.

On December 20, 1955, the telephone company filed an answer, the principal allegation of which was that pursuant to Decision No. 41415, dated April 6, 1948, in Case No. 4930 (47 Cal.
