O P I N I O N

Applicant filed this application on December 22, 1955. It seeks authority to suspend its public warehouse operations as to 159,775 square feet hitherto available to the storing public at 115 Townsend Street in San Francisco.

Applicant alleges in support of this request that its lease has expired and the owner has sold the premises. It seeks suspension while it searches for a new location at which equivalent space may be made available. Applicant has other locations in San Francisco at which goods will continue to be accepted as usual.

There appears to be nothing in the public interest requiring denial of this application. By granting the request the operating right will be preserved until a new location can be found. The suspension will be limited to a one-year period and made subject to such earlier cancellation, change or extension as circumstances may require.

O R D E R

The Commission having considered this application and basing its decision upon the findings and conclusions set forth in the foregoing opinion, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That Haslett Warehouse Company, a corporation, is authorized to suspend its operations as a public utility warehouseman, such suspension being restricted to 159,775 square feet of storage space operated by said warehouseman at No. 115 Townsend Street in the City and County of San Francisco, and that this authority shall expire one year after the effective date hereof unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
