Southern Pacific Company and The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company are authorized to construct an additional spur track at grade across Illinois Street and across and along 23rd Street in the City and County of San Francisco, at the location described in the application as amended, to be identified as a portion of Crossings Nos. 2 SF-1.40-C and 2 SF-1.44, respectively. The spur will connect to the existing spur track along 23rd Street serving the Walkup Drayage and Warehouse Company. Construction of said crossings shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superclevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the streets now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding three percent. Protection shall be by two existing and three additional Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B). Applicants shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Applicants areauthorized to deviate from the requirements of Section 3.17 of General Order No. 26-D provided that other requirements of said General Order are complied with.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicants shall so advise the Commission in writing. This

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authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
