OPINION

Manuel Castanon is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits issued to him by this Commission.

Applicant seeks an order authorizing him to conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of fresh fruits and vegetables between Coachella Valley points and Los Angeles, San Francisco and Oakland.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that the application be granted to the extent set forth in the ensuing order. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equipment, personnel and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation authorized therein. A public hearing is not necessary.

Applicant is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be changed or destroyed at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days

after the date hereof.

APPENDIX A

Manuel Castanon, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the above-numbered decision, is authorized to transport vegetables, fresh or green, (not cold pack or frozen) including fresh mushrooms, fruits, fresh or green (not cold pack or frozen) between Coachella Valley Territory (defined as the area lying between the little San Bernardino Mountains and Cottonwood Mountain on the one hand, and the San Jacinto and Santa Rosa Mountains on the other; and bounded on the northwest by Edom on U. S. Highway No. 99 and Indian Wells on State Highway No. 111, and on the southeast by the Riverside-Imperial County Line on U. S. Highway No. 99 and Southern Pacific Company station of Mortmar on State Highway No. 111), on the one hand, and Los Angelos, on the other hand. Such authority does not include the right to render service to, from or between intermediate points.
