OPINION AND ORDER

This is an application for an order authorizing Charles F. MacGregor to lease to Theodore T. Violette for one year the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by this Commission's Decision No. 44490, dated June 27, 1950. The certificate authorizes Charles F. MacGregor to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of certain articles and commodities related to water and water facilities, between Los Angeles and Marysville over and along U. S. Highway 99, and specified distances from such points and highway.

The proposed contract of lease provides that Theodore T. Violette will pay Charles F. MacGregor \$200 a month as consideration for the lease of the above-mentioned certificate of public convenience and necessity and certain operative rights granted by the Interstate Commerce Commission. The application shows that Charles F. MacGregor desires to make the lease of a portion of his transportation business because of health conditions, and Theodore T. Violette is qualified to conduct the operations both financially and by experience.

Upon review of the verified application, and upon the authority of Section 1063 of the Public Utilities Code, we are of the

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opinion, and so find, that the proposed lease will not be adverse to the public interest, that a public hearing is not necessary, and that the application should be granted, as herein provided, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDFRED as follows:

1. Charles F. MacGregor and Theodore T. Violette may enter into a contract to lease with respect to the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 44490, dated June 27, 1950, which contract shall be in, or substantially in, the same form as that filed in this proceeding as Exhibit A.

2. Within 30 days after the execution of such lease, Theodore T. Violette shall file in triplicate and concurrently make effective, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, appropriate tariffs satisfictory to the Commission.

3. The suthority herein granted will become effective on the date hereof.
