O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct two additional yard tracks at grade across Newhall Street in the City of San Jose, Santa Clara County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. E-45.1. Construction of said crossings shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G.O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding four percent. Protection shall be by existing two Standard No. 1A crossing signs (G.O. No. 75-B) and existing two overhead floodlights. All train movements across the proposed two yard tracks shall be flagged by a member of the train crew or other competent employee of the railroad company acting as flagman in addition to that flagging protection provided by a crossing watchman now assigned to protect this crossing. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant has advised that the use of the proposed yard tracks will facilitate train movements during the coming perishable food season and has requested immediate authorization.

Therefore the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
