ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By this application William H. Anderson seeks authority to charge less than the established minimum rates for the transportation of lumber from Happy Camp to Yreka. Hearing was held March 9, 1956 before Examiner J. E. Thompson at San Francisco when evidence was adduced and the matter was submitted. Since that date the Commission ordered hearings be held in Case No. 5432 for the purpose of receiving evidence to determine whether the established rates for the transportation of lumber from Happy Camp to Yreka should be amended. Pursuant to such order, hearing was held April 10, 1956; evidence was received and the matter taken under submission. The Commission has made its determination in this matter and has today issued its decision ordering the establishment of minimum rates for the transportation of lumber from Happy Camp to Yreka at approximately the same level as those sought herein by the applicant. The application thereby having become moot, and good cause appearing;

IT IS ORDERED that the application of William H. Anderson
be and it is hereby dismissed.
