FOURTH SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Southern Pacific Company on May 4, 1956 filed with the Commission a request for an extension of time of six months from the time limit mentioned in Condition No. 2 of Decision No. 51828, dated August 16, 1955. Said condition requires that on or before May 15, 1956 overhead clearances shall be increased to not less than 23 feet 8 inches above top of rail to the lowest point of each of the four structures listed therein. Applicant alleges that because of other work, establishment of its new Yuma Division and the shortage of manpower, it has been unable to provide such clearances at these locations.

It appears that this request is reasonable and should be granted, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that the time limit for compliance with Condition No. 2 in Decision No. 51828 is hereby extended to and including November 15, 1956.

In all other respects Decision No. 51828 shall remain in force and effect.
