OPINION Los Angeles City Express, Inc., is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits issued by this Commission. Applicant seeks an order authorizing it to extend its service as a highway common carrier so as to transport general commodities generally between a Los Angeles area as defined in the application and various points in the Los Angeles Commercial Zone, Los Angeles Harbor Commercial Zone, and the Counties of Orange, Riverside and San Bernardino. Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission. Upon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that the application be granted to the extent set forth in the ensuing order. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equipment, personnel and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation authorized herein. A public hearing is not necessary. -1such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

- (b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and upon not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.
- (3) That all other highway common carrier operative rights hitherto possessed by applicant are cancelled simultaneously with the making of the filings required by and pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (2) hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.

Los Angeles, Venice, Inglewood, Hollywood, Hawthorne and Pasadena, on the one hand, and Azusa, Monrovia, Altadena, Arcadia, Fontana, Ontario, San Bernardino, Corona, Riverside, Pomona, Colton, Redlands, Banning and Claremont, on the other hand. (3) Los Angeles, Venice and Inglewood, on the one hand, and Santa Ana, Anaheim, Orange, Laguna Beach, Huntington Beach, Fullerton, La Habra and Artesia, on the other hand. The authorities set forth in paragraphs (2) and (3) above do not include the right to render service to, from or between intermediate points. Applicant shall not establish thru routes and joint rates, charges and classifications as to the separate authorities hereinabove set forth in paragraphs (1), (2) and (3). Applicant shall not transport any shipments of: (1) Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.

(3) Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine. Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment. (5) Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semi-plastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles. (6) Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks. (7) Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.

LOS ANGELES TERRITORY includes that area embraced by the following boundary: Beginning at the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and U.S. Highway No. 101, Alternate: thence northeasterly on Sumset Boulevard to State Highway No. 7; northerly along State Highway No. 7 to State Highway No. 118; northeasterly along State Highway No. 118 through and including the City of San Fernando; continuing northeasterly and southeasterly along State Highway No. 118 to and including the City of Pasadena; easterly along U.S. Highway No: 66 to State Highway No. 19; southerly along State Highway No. 19 to Lower Azusa Road; easterly on Lower Azusa Road to its intersection with the San Gabriel River; southerly along the west bank of the San Gabriel River to Beverly Boulovard; southeasterly on Beverly Boulevard to Painter Avenue in the City of Whittier; southerly on Painter Avenue to State Highway No. 26; westerly along State Highway No. 26 to the west bank of the San Gabriel River; southerly along the west bank of the San Gabriel River to Imperial Highway; westerly on Imperial Highway to State Highway No. 19; southerly along State Highway No. 19 to its intersection with U. S. Highway No. 101, Alternate, at Ximeno Street; southerly along Ximeno Street and its prolongation to the Pacific Ocean; westerly and northerly along the shore line of the Pacific Ocean to a point directly south of the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and U. S. Highway No. 101, Alternate; thence northerly along an imaginary line to point of beginning.
