O P I N I O N

Tanner Motor Tours, Ltd., requests authority to combine two presently certificated sightseeing tours in the Los Angeles, Hollywood, Beverly Hills and Beach territories and charge a rate less than the combination rates presently authorized for the two tours.

As justification for the authority sought, applicant alleges that the present tours each take approximately a half-day to complete; that the fare for one tour is \$3.05 plus tax, and the fare for the other tour is \$2.41 plus tax; and that the proposed all day combination tour would be operated over presently authorized routes for a fare of \$5 plus tax.

After consideration the Commission is of the opinion and so finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the authority sought. A public hearing does not appear to be necessary.

O R D E R

Application having been filed and the Commission being informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That in addition to its presently authorized Routes Nos. 3 and 4, Tanner Motors Tours, Ltd., is hereby authorized to combine said routes and establish an all day trip, and is hereby authorized to establish and charge a rate of \$5 plus tax, therefor.

- a. Within sixty days after the effective date hereof and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized, and shall file in triplicate and concurrently make effective appropriate tariffs and timetables.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
