O P I N I O N

E. Guy Warren, doing business as Warren Transportation Company, is engaged in the transportation of property in California as a certificated highway common carrier.

He is authorized to operate within the San Francisco Territory and between the San Francisco Territory, as defined in Decision No. 45792, and points and places located on and within twenty-five miles of various specified highways, subject to the restriction that he shall not transport shipments of less than 20,000 pounds or shipments subject to a charge lower than that applicable to a shipment of 20,000 pounds.

Applicant seeks the removal of such weight restriction.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application, the Commission finds that the public convenience and necessity require that the application be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

The Commission has considered the application filed herein, Now Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That the 20,000-pound restriction set forth in Decision No. 45417, dated May 6, 1951, in Application No. 30128 and as amended by Decision No. 45792 dated June 5, 1951 and Decision No. 50499, dated August 31, 1954, in Application No. 35355 is hereby deleted therefrom.

(2) That within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
