O R D E R

The State of California, Department of Public Works, is authorized to construct State Highway Route 4 (U.S. 99) at separated grades under the track of Southern Pacific Company, at Galt, Sacramento County, at the location as shown by map (Exhibit "B") attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. DG-112.8-B. The aforesaid Department of Public Works also is authorized to construct a crossing at grade for temporary use as a detour at the location and in the manner described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. DG-112.85. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Company, shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days from the date hereof. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Upon completion of the project, Crossings Nos. DG-112.81 and DG-112.85 shall be abandoned and closed.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order

applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within two years unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
