ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHTS

It appearing by Commission Decision No. 51908 dated August 30, 1955, in the above application that a certificate of public convenience and necessity was issued to Petro-Lum, Inc., by order conditioned upon its providing within ninety days \$10,000 additional capital; that said period was later extended to December 30, 1955; that no evidence of compliance with said condition has been presented to the Commission and said applicant Petro-Lum, Inc. is now in default,

And it further appearing that said applicant has failed to file a tariff or institute service prior to November 30, 1955, in accordance with subparagraph (b) of ordering paragraph (2) of said decision, and therefore it is found that said applicant has abandoned and relinquished all rights under said certificate,

Now Therefore It Is Ordered that the certificate issued to Petro-Lum, Inc., by Decision No. 51908 in this proceeding is hereby revoked.

The secretary is directed to cause a certified copy of this order to be served upon Petro-Lum, Inc. by delivering it to Marvin J. Colangelo, Crocker Building, San Francisco 4, California.

The effective date of this order shall be the twentieth day after service of a copy hereof upon Petro-Lum, Inc., unless said Petro-Lum, Inc. before said effective date shall have filed with

this Commission a written response to the order, denying the facts set forth herein as constituting an abandonment of said certificate and requesting a public hearing thereon, in which event the effective date of this order will be stayed until hearing is had and further order issued.
