## <u>OPINION</u>

On April 14, 1953, this Commission issued Decision

No. 48484 in Application No. 34107 authorizing Coast Counties Gas and

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Electric to increase its gas rates in order to offset a contingent increase in the cost of gas to it. Coast Counties was merged with Pacific Gas and Electric Company, effective August 31, 1954, pursuant to authorization granted by Decision No. 50366.

The Pacific Gas and Electric Company was authorized by Decision No. 50744 (amended February 23, 1955, by Decision No. 51126) issued November 4, 1954, in Application No. 35256, and by Decision No. 51360 issued April 19, 1955, in Application No. 36635 to increase its gas rates in order to offset certain contingent charges which El Paso Natural Gas Company had put into effect.

The Southern California Gas Company similarly was authorized by Decision No. 47992 issued December 2, 1952, in Application No. 33700 and by Decision No. 51359 issued April 19, 1955, in Application No. 34975 (Second Supplemental) to increase its gas rates in order to offset certain contingent charges which El Paso Natural Gas Company was to and did put into effect.

The Southern Counties Gas Company of California likewise was authorized by Decision No. 47991 issued December 2, 1952, in Application No. 33699 and by Decision No. 51361 issued April 19, 1955, in Application No. 35742 (Second Supplemental) to increase its gas rates to offset certain contingent charges which El Paso Natural Gas Company was to and did or had put into effect.

The offset rate increases authorized by Decisions Nos. 47991, 47992, 48484 and 50744 (amended by Decision No. 51126) arose as a result of the proceedings in F.P.C. Docket No. G-2018 and those authorized by Decisions Nos. 51359, 51360 and 51361 arose as a result of the proceedings in F.P.C. Docket No. G-4769. By all of said Commission decisions the customers of the California gas companies were and are fully protected as to possible refunds.

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On February 27, 1956, the Supreme Court of the United States rendered decisions in United Gas Pipeline Company v. Mobile Gas Service Corporation and Federal Power Commission, v. Mobile Gas Service Corporation, Nos. 17 and 31, October Term, 1955, and Federal Power Commission v. Sierra Pacific Power Company, and Pacific Gas and Electric Company v. Sierra Pacific Power Company, Nos. 51 and 53, October Term, 1955, the effect of which decisions was to raise certain questions respecting the jurisdiction of the Federal Power Commission to accept for filing and review the increased gas rate schedules of El Paso Natural Gas Company involved in Federal Power Commission Docket No. G-2018 and Docket No. G-4769. On March 20, 1956, this Commission (the California Public Utilities Commission) issued orders in each of the proceedings herein reopening such proceedings for further hearing for the purpose of determining whether any or all of the decisions of this Commission previously referred to herein should be modified.

The matters were consolidated for hearing and will be consolidated for decision. Public hearings were held before the Commission en banc and Examiner Wilson E. Cline in San Francisco on April 26, 1956, and before Commissioner Ray E. Untereiner, Commissioner Rex Hardy, and Examiner Wilson E. Cline in Los Angeles on April 27, 1956. Commissioner Ray E. Untereiner presided at the hearings. On May 14, 1956, after the receipt of certain latefiled exhibits and after the filing of briefs the matters herein, in so far as they related to F.P.C. Docket No. G-2018, were taken

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under submission. The proceedings were left open for the later consideration of the matters herein pertaining to F.P.C. Docket No. G-4769. Late-filed Exhibits Nos. CF-1A, CF-9, and CF-35 through CF-38 are hereby made a part of the record herein.

After full consideration of the record and the law involved we are of the opinion and hereby find that none of the decisions of this Commission previously issued herein should be modified at this time.

# <u>ORDER</u>

Further public hearings having been held, the matters having been considered and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. None of the decisions issued in the proceedings herein shall be modified until further order of this Commission.

2. These proceedings are discontinued in so far as matters pertaining to Federal Power Commission Docket No. G-2018 are concerned but are held open for the later consideration of the matters herein pertaining to Federal Power Commission Docket No. G-4769.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
