THIRTEENTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds a city carrier permit. Prior orders in this proceeding have authorized it, under Section 4015 of the Public Utilities Code, to deviate from the established minimum rates in connection with specified San Francisco drayage operations. The authority expired June 5, 1956.<sup>1</sup> Permission is sought to continue to deviate from the minimum rates for a further one-year period with certain increases in the authorized rates.

The supplemental application states that, except for increased labor costs, the conditions which justified deviation from the minimum rates generally still obtain; that the proposed increase in the authorized rates would offset the higher costs; and that operations under the proposed rates may reasonably be expected to be profitable.

In the circumstances it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates and charges are reasonable and consistent with the public interest. This is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The supplemental application will be granted. Inasmuch as the authority expired June 5, 1956, the order will be made effective on the date hereof.

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<sup>1</sup> The operations involve the transportation of flour for Langendorf United Bakeries, Inc., and newsprint paper for Hearst Publications, Inc. Previous authorities also involved the transportation of general commodities for S & W Fine Foods and Equitable Cash Grocery. That matter is now covered by Application No. 37490.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

(1) That Walkup Drayage and Warehouse Company be and it is hereby authorized to transport property as described in and subject to the conditions and restrictions set forth in Appendix "A", attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, between points within the City and County of San Francisco, at rates less than the minimum rates established for such transportation but not less than the rates shown in said Appendix "A".

(2) That the authority herein granted shall expire June 5, 1957, unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.

APPENDIX "A" TO DECISION NO. 53206

Item 1

Flour transported for Langendorf United Bakeries, Inc., in quantities of not less than 50,000 barrels per calendar year:

In haul (1)\$ .16 per 100 pounds

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Item 2

Newsprint Paper, in rolls transported for Hearst Publications, Inc., in quantities of not less than 35,000 tons per calendar year:

(1)\$1.50 per ton

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Except as otherwise provided herein, rates and charges named in this appendix are subject to the rules and regulations provided in City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A (Appendix "A" of Decision No. 49886 in Case No. 4084).

- (1) Not subject to the provisions of Item No. 60A series of said City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A with respect to tailgate loading and tailgate unloading.
