Decision No. 53352

BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of Bob W. Clark, doing business as WILCO VACUUM SERVICE, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity as a petroleum irregular route carrier to operate a vacuum tank truck service within a radius of sixty miles from base of operations, with emergency service to all areas in the State of California being developed or explored for oil.

OBINION

By application filed February 21, 1956, Bob W. Clark requests the issuance of a certificate of public convenience and necessity as a petroleum irregular route carrier for the transportation of petroleum products in vacuum tank trucks within a radius of sixty miles from Taft, California, with emergency service to other parts of the state.

Public hearing was held in Taft on April 19, 1956, before Examiner Rowe, at which time evidence was adduced and the matter duly submitted.

Since February, 1953, applicant has been engaged in operating a vacuum tank service, with his primary base in Taft. The services performed consist of oiling and watering roads, cleaning sumps and tanks, and hauling water, waste materials and

In performing this service he has received many calls for service from oil companies which incidentally requires his transporting petroleum and petroleum products over the public highways.

Applicant has adequate equipment and is experienced in this type of work. His financial position is sufficient to assure a successful operation. Applicant testified that, so far as service in the area beyond the radius of sixty miles from Taft is concerned, he wished to perform it only for customers based in the Taft area who requested emergency service beyond said area.

Protestant Potter testified in opposition to the application. He stated that he wishes to have applicant certificated but wants him to file a tariff in line with the tariffs of others authorized to perform this service. Applicant proposes to charge for his services on an hourly basis, \$12.50 per hour for the 90 barrel unit; \$10.50 per hour for the 70 barrel unit and \$8.50 per hour for the 45 and 50 barrel units, all plus tax. The record shows that applicant has operated profitably under such rates.

The Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that applicant institute and perform service as a petroleum irregular route carrier for the transportation of petroleum and petroleum products in vacuum tank trucks within a radius of 60 miles from Taft, California. The Commission is of the opinion that no right should be granted to serve customers beyond said area.

Bob W. Clark is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for (b) That within a period of sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and shall file and concurrently make effective appropriate tariffs naming rates, rules and regulations on an hourly basis.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
