O R D E R

City of Oakland is authorized to alter and widen Bancroft Avenue at 104th Avenue and to construct Link Street at grade across a track of Southern Pacific Company in the City of Oakland, Alameda County, at the locations described in the application to be identified as Crossings Nos. DH-14.9-C (erroneously referred to as Crossing No. DH-14.94-C in the application) and DH-14.83-C, respectively. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Widths of crossings shall be as shown in the application with grades of approach not greater than two percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) at each location.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied

with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
