## OPINTON

Farry MeKonzio Trucking Co. is ongaged in the transportation of proporty in Californio purguant to permits issued by this Commission.

Appilcant seoks an order authorizing it to conduct service as a bighway comon carrier for the transportation of general commodities, with excoptions, botweon most San Joaquin Valloy points and Los Angelos Basin Territory, San Francisco Torritory and Stockton.

Notice of filing of tho appilcation was given all common carniers subjoct to tine jurisdiction of this Commsesion.

Upon considoration of the aliegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentionod notice, the Cormission finds that pubilc convenionce and nocessity require that the epplication be granted to the oxtert set forth in the ensuing owdor. It appears that appincant possosses the experience, equipment, personnel and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation authorized horoin. A pubile hoaring is not necessary.

Applicant is horeby placea on notice that oporative rigkts, as suck, do not constituto a class of proporty which may bo capitalized or usod as an element of value in rate fixing for any
amount of money in excess of that originalif paid to the state as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from thelr purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of businoss over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be changed or destroyed at any time by the State, which is not in any respect ifmit od as to tho number of rights which may be givon.

The Comission has considerod the application and representations filed heroin, Now Therefore

IT IS ORDERED:
(1) That a cortificate of pubilc convenience and necessity is granted to Harry McKenzie Trucking Conauthorizing it to operate as a highway common carrier as dorinod by Section 213 of the Pubilc Ütilities Code for the transportation of property botweon the points and orer the routes as more particulariy sot forth in Appondix A, Appendix $B$ ond Appondix $C$ attachod horoto and mado a part heroof.
(2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate heroin granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
(a) Within thirty days aiter the effective date heroor, applicant shall filo a written accoptanco of the certificate herein granted. By accopting the certificate of public convenience and necessity horein granted, applicant is placed on notico tinat it will be required, among other things, to ifle annual roports of its operations and to comply with and observe the sefety rules and other regulations of the Commission's Genoral Order No. 99. Failure to f110 such reports, in such form and at such time as the Cormission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may result in a cancellation of tho operating authority granted by this decision.
(b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less, than ton days ' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized'and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.
