## OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum rates, rules and regulations for the transportation of fresh fruits and vegetables are set forth in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8. Pursuant to petitions filed by W. M. Wright, doing business as Wright Trucking Co., and Ben Tyrrell, doing business as Tyrrell Transportation Co., commodity rates for the transportation of potatoes and onions within the area around Stockton and from the Delta Producing Area were established.<sup>1</sup>

By this petition, Wright Trucking Lines, Inc., (successor to W. M. Wright) and Ben Tyrrell ask that the special commodity rates be amended by adding a restrictive rule providing that "rates of inland water common carriers shall not be applied in lieu of the rates provided in this item." Petitioners point out that, under the alternative application provisions of the tariff, common carrier rates, except rates of coastwise common carriers by vessels, may be applied in lieu of the rates provided in the tariff. According to petitioners, certain inland water carrier rates for the transportation

The Delta Producing Area includes Stockton and the following islands or tracts: King, Empire, Venice, Rindge, Terminous, Brack, McDonald, Mandeville, Bacon and Roberts. of potatoes and onions between the points herein involved are published at a level lower than those provided in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8. Petitioners allege that the inland vessel carriers involved have not performed any such transportation of potatoes and onions within the last ten years, and that these rates are used only by itinerant truckers as a means of avoiding assessing the rates in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8. Petitioners also allege that this practice will jeopardize the operations of the regular carriers in the area and, in the long run, will harm the public.

Petitioners point out that the special commodity rates in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 were established on the basis of studies made by the Commission's staff and were determined to be reasonable minimum rates for the transportation of potatoes and onions by motor vehicles between the points involved.

Interested parties have been notified of the filing of the petition. No objection to its being granted has been offered.

This is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. It appears that the public interest will be served by restricting the application of the potato and onion rates as sought by petitioner. The petition will be granted. As the shipping season is imminent, the tariff changes will be made effective September 4, 1956, the earliest date which will permit printing and service of the order.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 (Appendix "C" to Decision No. 33977 as amonded) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective September 4, 1956, Eighth Revised Page 36 Cancels Seventh Revised Page 36, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
