OPINION

Bruno Malucchi is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits issued by this Commission.

Applicant seeks an order authorizing him to conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of general commodities, with certain exceptions, between San Francisco and all points in Alameda County, on the one hand, and all points on the San Francisco Peninsula as far south as San Jose, Hollister, Salinas, Watsonville, Carmel, Monterey, Pacific Grove and Santa Cruz, on the other hand.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that the application be granted to the extent set forth in the ensuing order. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equipment, personnel and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation authorized herein. A public hearing is not necessary.

Applicant is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be

(b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

Appendix A Bruno Malucchi Original Page 1 Bruno Malucchi, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport general commodities between San Mateo and San Jose and intermediate points via U. S. Highways 101 and 101 By-pass. Applicant shall not establish through routes and joint rates, charges and classifications between the authority hereinabove set forth and the operative rights granted by Decision No. 50992 in Application No. 35202, excepting, however, that this restriction shall not apply as to San Francisco and San Jose and intermediate points via U.S. Highways 101 and 101 By-pass. Applicant shall not transport any shipments of: 1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A. 2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis. 3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine. 4. Commodities requiring the use of special refrigoration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment. 5. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk,

in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
