> In the Matter of the Application of COASI IINE TRUCK SERVICE, INC., a corporation, for a cortificate of public convenionco and necossity to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of property.

## OPINION

Cosst Line Truck Service, Inc., is engaged in the transportation of property in Califomia pursuant to pormits and certiricates of public convenience and nocossity issued by this Comission.

Applicant soeks an order authorlzing it to extond its service as a highway comon carrier so as to transport general commodities, generally betweon points in Mendocino County, in the north, and points in San Diogo Territory, in the south, inciuding various points intermediate thereto.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carmiors subject to the jurisdicition of this Commission.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, the Commission finds that pubile convenience and nocessity require that the application be granted to the extent sot forth In the ensuing order. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equipment, personnel and financial rosources to institute and maintain the operation authorized herein. A public hearing is not necessary.

Applicant is heroby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that origimally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Asfde from their purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial momopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be changed or destroyed at any time by the State, which is not in any respect $\operatorname{limited}$ as to the number of rights which may be givon.

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The Commission has considorod the application and representations ifled herein, Now Therefore

II IS ORDERED:
(1) That a cortiricate of pubilc convenience and nocessity is granted to Coast inine Trucin Servico, Inc., a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a highway common carrior as definod by Soction 213 of the Public Utilities Codo for the transportation of property betweon the points as more particularly set forth in Appondix A and Appendix B attached hereto and made a part hereof as enlargement of and to be consolidated with operating rights heretofore possessed by applicant, providod, however, that in no evont shall said oporating rights be duplicatod.
(2) That in providing service punsuant to the certificate horoin grantod, applicant shall comply with and obsorve the following service regulations:
(a) Within thirty days after the offective date hereof, applicant shall file a writton accoptance of the cortificate herein granted: By accepting the certiricate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that it wili be
required, among other things, to isle annual reports of its operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 99. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
(b) Within sixty days after the offectivo date heron, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make offoctivo, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.

Coast In Truck Service, Inc., by the certiricate of public convonience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport:
A. General commodities, except applicant shali not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and porsonal offects not packed in accordance with the crated property requiroments sot forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minirum Rato Tariff NO. 4-A.
2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger autamobiles (including joeps), ambulancos, hearses and taxis; frejeht automobiles, aut omobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, busos and bus chassis.
3. Iivestock, $\nabla$ iz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattie, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, axon, pigs, sheop, shoep camp outifts, sows, steers, stags or swine.
4. Commodities requiring the use of speciai refriseration or temperature controi in specialiy designed and constructed refrigerated equipmont.
5. Liquids, comprossed gasos, commoditios in semiplastic form and comoditios in suspension in ilquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or combination of such highway vehicles.
6. Commodities whon transportod in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
7. Commodities whon transported in motor vehicies equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
a. Betweon San Francisco Territory as defined In Appendix B attached bereto, on the one hand, and Pacific Grove, Seaside, Monterey and Carmel, on the other hand.
