## OPINION

Ralph S. Newcomer is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits issued by this Commission.

Applicant seeks an order authorizing him to conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of general commodities, with certain exceptions, generally between points within the Los Angoles Basin Territory.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that the application be granted to the extent set forth in the ensuing order. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equipment, personnel and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation authorized herein. A public hearing is not necessary.

Applicant is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as

(b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

Newcomer, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport general commodities between all points within the Los Angeles Territory as more particularly described in Appendix B attached hereto. Applicant shall not transport any shipments of: 1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No: 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A. 2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis. 3. Livestock; vizi: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen; pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine. 4. Commodities requiring the use of special refrig-eration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles: 6. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks. 7. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit. S. Highway No. 66 to State Highway No. 19; southerly along State Highway No. 19 to Lower Azusa Road; easterly on Lower Azusa Road to its intersection with the San Gabriel River; southerly zlong the west bank of the San Gabriel River to Beverly Boulevard; southeasterly on Boverly Boulevard to Painter Avenue in the City of Whittier; southerly on Painter Avenue to State Highway No. 26; westerly along State Highway No. 26 to the west bank of the San Gabriel River to Imperial Highway; westerly on Imperial Highway to State Highway No. 19; southerly along State Highway No. 19 to its intersection with U. S. Highway No. 101, Alternate, at Ximeno Street; southerly along Ximeno Street and its prolongation to the Pacific Ocean; westerly and northerly along the shore line of the Pacific Ocean to a point directly south of the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and U. S. Highway No. 101, Alternate; thence northerly along an imaginary line to point of beginning.
