The complaint for restoration of telephone service at 49 East Colorado Street, Pasadena, California, was filed on August 14, 1956. It is therein alleged that the telephone service furnished to complainant at the above address was a public pay telephone. On August 24, 1956, the defendant filed an answer in which it alleged that the telephone service in question was a public nonlisted, nonsubscriber telephone station.

Public hearings on the matter were held in Los Angeles on September 27, 1956 and October 15, 1956. At the latter hearing the Deputy County Counsel stated that the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office had no objection to the reinstatement of the public telephone service on complainant's premises at 49 East Colorado Street, Pasadena, California. The complainant's attorney thereupon moved for a dismissal of the complaint.

Good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED that the complaint of Joe-Paul Corporation against The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company for restoration of public nonlisted, nonsubscriber telephone service at 49 East Colorado Street, Pasadena, California, be and the same hereby is dismissed. The defendant may, if it so desires, reinstall a public telephone in the complainant's premises at 49 East Colorado Street, Pasadena, California, subject to the defendant's applicable rules and regulations on file with this Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
