## Decision No. Ex951

BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA
In the Matter of the Application 0 ) BURTON TRUCK \& TRANSFER CO., a corporation, for a certificate of pubiic convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier of general commoditics with some exceptions between various points and places in Southern California.

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Q P I N I O M
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Burton Truck \& Transfer Co. is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits and a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by this Commission. Burton Truck \& Transfer co. seek an order authorizing it to conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of general commodities generally between various points in Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Riverside and Orange Counties.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

A public hearing was held on Sept ember 28, 2956, at
Los Angeles before Examiner Carl Silverhart.
Protestants did not offer any testimony but engaged in cross-examination of applicant.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the apolication, the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice and the evidence adduced at the hearing, the commission finds that public convenience and necessity requirc that the application be granted to the extent set forth in the ensuing order. It appears
that applicant possesses the exporience, equipmont, personnci and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation authorized herein.

Applicant is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a cla ss of property which may be capitalized or uscd as an clement of valuc in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purcly permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business ovor a particular route. This monopoly fonture may be changed or destroyed at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to tho number of rights which may be given.

A pubiic hearine having been held, and basce upon the cvidence thercin adduced and the application and reprosentations filed berein,

IT IS ORDERED:
(1) That a cortificate of public convenicnce and necessity is Granted to Burton Truck \& Transfer Co., a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a highway common carrier as defined by Scction 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of property betweon the points as more particularly set forth in Appondix A and Appendix $B$ attachod hereto and made a part hereof.
(2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall filc a written acceptance of the cortificato herein grantod.

By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that it will be required, among other things, to filo annual reporte of its oporations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's Goneral Order No. 99. Failurc to filc such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commiosion may dircet, or to comply with and obscrvo the provisions of General order No. 99, may rosult in a cancoliation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
(b) Within sixty days after the effective date hercof, and on not less than ten days notico to tho commigsion and the public, applicant shadi ostablish the service hercin authorizod and file in triplicate, and concurrontly make effoctive, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.
(3) That the highway common carricr operative rights acquirod by Decision No. 49430, dated December 25,1953, in Application No.34921/ are dee cancoled oimultancously with the making of the filings required by and pursuant to the provisions of paragraph ( 2 )(a) and (b) hercof.

Burton Truck \& Transfer Co., by the certificate of public convonience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport gencral comodities between all points within the aroa more particularly delineated in Appendix B attached hereto.

Applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and persomi effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-0 of Minimum Ratc Tariff No. 4-A.
2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps) ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers, combined, buses, bus chassis.
3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calvos, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, cwes, goats, hogs, horses, kics, lambs, oxen, pigs, shecp, shcep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
4. Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment.
5. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semiplastic form and comodities in suspension in liquids in buik, in tank trucks, tank trailors, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehiclos.
6. Comrooditios whon transported in buik in dump trucks or in hopper type trucks.
7. Commoditics when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in trensit.

Beginning at the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and U. S. Highway No. 101, Altemate; thence northeasterly on Sunset Bounevard to State Highway No. 7; northerly along State Highway No. 7 to State Highway No. 118; northeasterly along State Highway No. 118 through and inciudirg the City of San Fernando; continuing northeasterly and southeasterly along State Highway No. 118 to and including the City of Pasedena; easterly along J. S. Highway No. 66 to State Highway No. 19; northerly along State Highway No. 19 to Foothill Boulevard; easterly on Foothill Soulevard to Valencia Way; northerly on Valencia Way to Hillerest Boulevard; northeasteriy on Hillerest Boulevard to Grand Avenue; southeasterly on Grand fivenue to Oak Park Lane; continuing on Oak Park Lanc and the eastern boundary of the City of Monrovia to Wildrose Avenue; easterly on Wildrose Avenue to Bradbury Avenue; southerly on Bradbury Avenue to Lemon Avenue; easterly on Lemon Avenue to Buem Vista Street; southerly on Buena Vista Strcet to Royal Oaks Drive; eastcrly on Royal Oaks Drive to the West Bank of the San Gabriel River; southeriy along the west bank of the San Gobriel River to Beverly Boulcvard; southeasterly on Beverly Boulevard to Painter fvenue in the City of Whitticr; southerly along Painter fvenue to U. S. Highway 101; southeasterly and southerly along U. S. Highway 101 to U. S. Highway 201, ByPass; southeasterly. along U. S. Highway 101, ByPass, to First Street; westerly along First Street and Bolsa Avenue to Bolsa Chica Road; northerly along Bolsa Chica Road to West 17 th Strect; westerly along West 17 th Street to Bay Boulevard; southerly along Bay Boulevard to the Pacific Ocean; westeriy and northerly along the shore line of the Pacific Ocean to a point directly south of the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and U. S. Highw ay No. 101, filternate; thence northerly along an imaginary line to point of begimning.
