West Coast Warehouse Corporation, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin is authorized to transport general commodities between all points and places within the following described area:

Beginning at the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and U. S. Highway No. 101, Alternate; thence northeasterly on Sunset Boulevard to State Highway No. 7; northerly along State Highway No. 7 to State Highway No. 118; northeasterly along State Highway No. 118 through and including the City of San Fernando; continuing northeasterly and southeasterly along State Highway No. 118 to and including the City of Pasadena; easterly along U. S. Highway No. 66 to State Highway No. 19; southerly along State Highway No. 19 to Lower Azusa Road; easterly on Lower Azusa Road to its intersection with the San Gabriel River; southerly along the West Bank of the San Gabriel River to Beverly Boulevard; southeasterly on Beverly Boulevard to Painter Avenue in the City of Whittier; southerly on Painter Avenue to Whittier Boulevard; southeasterly on Whittier Boulevard to Fullerton Road, southerly on Fullerton Road to Imperial Highway; southeasterly on Imperial Highway and Orchard Road to State Highway No. 55; southerly on State Highway No. 55 and its prolongation to the Pacific Ocean; westerly and northerly along the shore line of the Pacific Ocean to a point directly south of the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and U. S. Highway No. 101, Alternate; thence northerly along an imaginary line to the point of beginning.

Applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

- 1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
- 2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.

3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle,
cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses,
kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits,
sows, steers, stags or swine.

4. Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially
designed and constructed refrigerated equipment.

5. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspension in
liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers,
tank semitrailers or a combination of such
highway vehicles.

6. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump
trucks or in hopper-type trucks.

7. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
