In the Matter of the Application of HOWARD V. PETERSEN, doing business as PETERSEN'S TRUCK SERVICE, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate a highway common carrier service.

<u>O P I N I O N</u>

Howard V. Petersen is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits issued by this Commission.

Applicant seeks an order authorizing him to conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of general commodities between San Jose, San Francisco, off-route and intermediate points.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

A public hearing was held at San Francisco on October 30, 1956 before Examiner John Power.

Protestants presented no evidence of their own but cross-examined applicant and his witnesses.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application, the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice and the evidence adduced at the hearing, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that the application be

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granted to the extent set forth in the ensuing order. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equipment, personnel and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation authorized herein.

Applicant is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely pormissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be changed or destroyed at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.

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A public hearing having been held and based upon the evidence adduced therein and the application and representations filed herein,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Howard V. Petersen, authorizing him to operate as a highway common carrier as defined by Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of property between the points and over the routes as more particularly set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

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(2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that he will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of his operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 99. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
- (b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.

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Howard V. Petersen, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport the following commodities:

- 1. ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES OR EQUIPMENT, OR PARTS NAMED, as listed under that heading in Items Nos. 34020 through 35405 of Western Classification No. 76, George H. Dumas, Agent, on the issue date thereof.
- INSECTICIDES OR FUNGICIDES, AGRICULTURAL, as listed under that heading in Items Nos. 52960 through 53110 of Western Classification No. 76, George H. Dumas, Agent, on the issue date thereof.
- 3. INSECTICIDES, INSECT REPELLENTS OR VERMIN EXTERMINATORS, OTHER THAN AGRICULTURAL INSECTICIDE, as listed under that heading in Items Nos. 53125 through 53142 of Western Classification No. 76, George H. Dumas, Agent, on the issue date thereof.

BETWEEN:

- A. Sen Francisco and San Joso and points intermediate therete on U. S. Highways Nos. 101 and 101-A.
- B. Los Gatos, Campbell, Los Altos and Cupertino.
- C. Points in A above, on the one hand, and points in B, on the other hand.
