Culy Transportation Co., Inc., is engaged in the transportation of property in Calfiomia pursuant to cortiricates of pubife convonience and nocessity and permits issued by this Commission。

Applicant seeks an order authorizing it to extend its highray comon cerrier sorvice.

Notice of filing of the application was given all comon carriers subject to the furisalction of this Comission.

Jpon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, the Comission finds that puiolic convonience and necessity require that the appiscation be grantod. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equipmont, porsonnol and financial resources to smstitute and maintain the proposed operation. A public bearing is not necessary.

Applicant is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property vilicih may be capitailzed or used as an elemont of vaius in rate ilixing for any amount of money in excess of that originaily paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such ingints. Asice from thosir
purely pormissive aspect, suck rights extond to the hoicor a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly featime may be changed or destroyed at any time by the State, which is not in any sospect Ifmitod as to the number of rights which may be given.

The Comission has considered the application and representations ifled herein, Now Therefore

IT IS ORDERED:
(1) That a certificato of public convenience and necessity Is grantea to Culy Transportation Co., Inc., a comporation, authorizing it to operate as a highway comon carrier as derinod by Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of property between the points and over the routes as more particularif set forth in Appendix A and Appoadix B attachod bereto and made a part hereof.
(2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate berein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regijations:
(a) Vifthin tiarty days after the effective date horeor, appijcant shall ifle a writton acceptance of the certificato herein granted. By accopting the cortiflicate of pubile convenience and necessity horein granted. applicant is placed on zotice that it will be required, among other tiangs, to rile annual reports of its operations and to comply with anc observe the safety ruies and other regulations of the Comission's General Order No. 99. Failure to ifio such reports, in such form and at such time as the Comission may direct, onto comply with and observe the provisions of Genorai Order No. 99, may result in a canceliation of the operating authomity granted by this decision.
(b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days? notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service boron authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently mako effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Comission.
(3) That all operative rights possessed by applicant other than those granted in paragraph (1) hereof are cancelled 3imultanoousiy with the making of the ifilnge required by and pursuant to tho provisions of paragraph (2) above set forth.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.
