ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY INTERIM RELIEF

Betty Olsen and Carroll Enterline, doing business as Union Square Studio, of 278 Post Street, San Francisco, California, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that prior to March 9, 1957, complainants were subscribers of defendant under number Sutter 1-4827; that on or about March 9, 1957, the telephone was disconnected by defendant at the request of the San Francisco Police Department on the charge that complainants and employee were lewd and dissolute and common prostitutes; that complainants and said employee have pleaded not guilty to said charge; that complainants did not use and do not now intend to use said telephone facilities as an instrumentality to violate the law, nor in aiding or abetting such violation; and that complainants have suffered and will suffer irreparable injury and great hardship as a result of being deprived of telephone facilities; therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company is hereby directed to restore telephone service to complainants pending hearing on said complaint and further Commission order thereon, said service to be furnished pursuant to defendant's filed tariff rates and rules applicable thereto.

The Secretary is directed as follows:

- (1) To cause a certified copy of this order to be served upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company,
- (2) To cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainants.
