<u>O P I N I O N</u>

Highway Transport, Inc., (hereinafter sometimes referred to as Highway) and Nielsen Freight Lines, (hereinafter sometimes referred to as Nielsen) presently operating as highway common carriers, request authority to extend their services to points in Marin and Napa Counties.

Public hearing was held before Examiner Thomas E. Daly at San Francisco, and the matter was submitted on March 28, 1957.

Highway is presently operating in an area from Sausalito and Vallejo, in the north, to Pacific Grove, Monterey, Soledad and Tulare, in the south. Nielsen is presently operating generally between San Francisco, East Bay points and points north of Novato to and including Willits. Each applicant proposes a daily service

with the exception of Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, and each proposes to charge the minimum rates as established by the Commission in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. Both applicants assert that they have received numerous requests from customers to extend their operations as herein proposed. The record indicates that both possess the necessary equipment, facilities and financial ability to conduct the proposed extended operations.

Applicants introduced the testimony of approximately twenty-five shipper witnesses representing business establishments primarily located in San Francisco. In substance they testified that they are using one applicant or the other to presently certificated points, that they desired to have such services made available to the proposed area because of the convenience of using a single carrier with wide territorial coverage or because they found the existing services inadequate due to missed pickups, delays in transit and damage or unsatisfactory experiences in the handling of claims.

The appearance of J. A. Christenson Co. in the Nielsen matter was changed to that of an interested party upon an amendment to the application excluding the transportation of commodities requiring refrigeration in equipment containing mechanical refriger--. ation. During the course of hearing the Southern Pacific Company and Pacific Motor Transport Company withdrew their protests to the applications and so informed the Commission by letter.

Protestant, Merchants Express Corporation made an operational showing indicating the scope of its existing certificated rights and furnished specific information as to its schedules and equipment operating to the proposed area.

After consideration the Commission is of the opinion that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the applications.

ORDER

Applications having been filed and the Commission being informed in the premises;

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That as an extension and enlargement of its operative rights, a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Highway Transport, Inc., authorizing the transportation of property between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof.

(2) That as an extension and enlargement of its operative rights, a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Nielsen Freight Lines, authorizing the transportation of property between the points and over the routes as set forth in Appendix B attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof.

(3) That in providing the services herein-authorized in paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, applicants shall observe the following service regulations:

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicants shall file a written acceptance of the certificates herein granted.
- (b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than five days? notice to the Commission and the public, applicants shall establish the services herein authorized and file in triplicate and concurrently make effective appropriate tariffs.
