OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant has been conducting a public utility warehouse operation in Los Angeles County since 1947. It handles only cane or beet sugar, in bags, tins or cartons. By this application, as amended, it seeks authority to discontinue the operation and requests permission to cancel its Warehouse Tariff No. 1, Cal. P.U.C. No. 1.

The amended application states that at the present time there are no patrons using applicant's facilities and that there have been no storers since September 7, 1955. It also states that applicant has discontinued service as a warehouseman, that it has no demand for the service, that it does not anticipate any demand and that applicant does not intend to remain in business as a warehouseman. It also asserts that neither the public nor any person will be adversely affected by the discontinuance of the warehouse.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The sought authority to discontinue service will be granted. Also, applicant's tariff on file with the Commission will be canceled.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Lady's Choice Products Company be and it is hereby authorized to discontinue service as a public utility warehouseman at 4578 Worth Street, County of Los Angeles, and that its Warehouse Tariff No. 1, Cal. P.U.C. No. 1, be and it is hereby canceled.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
