## OPINIQN

Peerless Trucking Co., a.corporation, is engaged in the transportation of property in Cailfornia pursuant to permits issued by this Commission.

Applicant seeks an order authonizing it to conduct service as a bighway comon carrier for the transportationof general commodities between points in Ios Angeles Territory and in the vicinity thereor.

Notice of fliligg of the application was given ali common carriers subject to the jurisaiction of this Comssion.

A public hearing was held at Ios Angeles on April 27, 1957, before Examiner Power. Applicant presented one operating and threo public witnesses. Protestant assisted in developing the record.

Jpon consideration of the allegations of the application, the representations filled pursuant to the abovementioned notice and the evidence adduced at the bearing, the Commssion finds that public convenience and necessity require that the application be granted to the extent set forth in the ensuing order. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equfpment, personnel and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation authorized berein.

Applicant is bereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitate a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amome of money in excess of that originaily paid to the State' as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their preay permissive aspect, such rights extend to the bolder a full or partial monopoly of a ciass of business over a particmiar route. This monopoly feature may be changed or destroyed at any time by the State, which 13 not in any respect ismited as to the number of rights which may be given.

A public hearing having been held and based upon the evidence adduced therein and the application and representations filed herain,

IT IS ORDERED:
(I) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity Is granted to Peerless Prucking con, a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a highway comon carrier as defined by Section 213 of the Piblic Utilities Code for the transportation of property between the points and over the routes as more particuianiy set forth in Appendix A and Appendix B attached hereto and made a part hereof.
(2) That in providing service pursuant to the certipicate herein granted, applicant shail comply with and observe the foliowing service regriations:
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shail file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applacant is placed on notice that it wili be required, among

Other things, to file annual reports of its operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 99. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as" the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may resit in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
(b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the commission and the pubic, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and ifni in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days

3. İvestock; $v z z_{0}$, bucks, buils, calves, cattie, cows, dalry cattie, ewes, goats, bogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
4. Commoditics requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in spect.aily designed and constructed refrigerated equipment.
5. Ifquids, compressed gases, comodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspersion-in i1quids in buik, in tanie trucks, tank trailers, tark semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicies.
