ORDER

The Department of Public Works of the State of California is authorized to construct a crossover of Santa Monica Boulevard (State Route 162) at grade across the Hollywood Line of Pacific Electric Railway Company in Beverly Hills, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 6H-11.33. Applicant is also authorized to alter Crossing No. 6H-11.26 (Doheny Drive) as described in the application. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B).

The expense of the project shall be borne in accordance with the terms of an agreement to be entered into between the parties, and a copy of the executed agreement shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction.

Width of Crossing No. 6H-11.33 shall be not less than 36 feet and grades of approach not greater than three per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of

General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B).

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
