OFDER AMENDING DECISION NO. 54794

Decision No. 54794 provided for suspension of respondents' permit for a period of five consecutive days "starting at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the effective date" of that decision. A petition for rehearing was filed in time to suspend such effective date pending action on the petition for rehearing. Rehearing was denied on May 21, 1957, on which date the decision became effective. Thus the permit was technically suspended as of 12:01 a.m. on May 22, 1957, and before respondents had knowledge of the denial of rehearing. Under the circumstances counsel for respondents was advised by the staff that the inadvertency would be brought to the Commission's attention with a recommendation that the order be amended to provide a new date for commencement of the suspension period, so that respondents would have advance notice of the date of commencement of such suspension period, and thus be in a position to comply therewith.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that ordering paragraph (1) of Decision No. 54794 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(1) That Radial Highway Common Carrier Permit No. 39-3846

issued to Justo Sanzberro and Albert Yroz, doing business as Sanzberro Livestock Transportation Co., be and it is hereby suspended for five consecutive days starting at 12:01 a.m. on Monday, June 10, 1957."

The Secretary is directed to cause personal service of this order to be made upon Justo Sanzberro and upon Albert Yroz, and to cause copies of this order to be mailed to all appearances.
