SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Commission by Decision No. 52661, in the above-entitled matter, granted Sycamore Canyon Water Company a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a public utility water corporation subject to certain conditions. One of such conditions is contained in paragraph l.c. of said decision and reads as follows:

"That applicant shall, within ninety days after the system is placed in operation under the rates and rules authorized herein, install pumping equipment in Well No. 1 and at its booster station of sufficient capacity to make available to the storage reservoir a total of at least 100 gallons of water per minute, and shall report to the Commission in writing within ten days thereafter of the completion of the installation."

Sycamore Canyon Water Company by petition filed May 15, 1957, requests an order of this Commission modifying the above-quoted paragraph and alleges that said Well No. 1 will produce no water even with additional pumping equipment. To provide adequate water as required by the Commission, petitioner states it has made arrangements with Highlanders Water Company to feed water into petitioner's system in such amounts that in excess of 100 gallons per minute will be made available. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that paragraph l.c. of Decision No. 52661 is amended to read as follows:

"That applicant shall, within ninety days after the system is placed in operation under the rates and rules authorized herein, make available to its storage reservoir a total of at least 100 gallons of water per minute, and shall report to the Commission in writing within ten days thereafter of the completion of the installations so required to make that water available."

In all other respects Decision No. 52661 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
